A Note from the Interim Co-Pastor

Friends,

When our church in Chapel Hill, NC voted to become Open and Affirming in 1993, people began to entrust us with stories. Stories for which we were ill prepared. At best, I managed to keep quiet and listen to accounts that revealed a world that I was only beginning to perceive. On the inside I was furiously trying to manage these stories into a framework that our buttoned-down, central NC Tarheel congregation could accept. But that's not how it worked out. It wasn't me who would be drawing the framework of what would work well for me, for the church and the surrounding community. In the words of Rev. Jaqui Lewis, Senior Minister of Middle Collegiate Church in Manhattan: "I'm straight but my church queered me." This is what happens when PRIDE, when Open and Affirming opens the doors to your church and you simply listen. "Queering" extends to reworking the very foundations of human identity and relationships. It is a joyous leave-taking from old notions of identity to the head-long reorienting of all of life towards God's way of love. This spontaneous outpouring of love and life lived with integrity does not calculate measured steps to what we can accept but seeks ever fuller and richer connection with those whom God has given us to love. This is the journey that UCC Boxborough has chosen and is extending to its celebration of Pride Sunday on June 16th. In this spirit we are excited to welcome Rev. Noah Brewer-Wallin who will preach a word "From a Trans Pastor to a Church in Transition." Welcome Noah!

Finally, we entered into small group discussions. Learnings from this conversation will help us as we prepare our Local Church Profile for our search for a settled Pastor.

Afghan Family Update

In the summer of 2021, UCC Boxborough agreed to partner with Congregation Beth Eloheim in Acton to sponsor a refugee family from Afghanistan under the auspices of Jewish Family Services. The congregations were amazingly generous, raising more than \$50,000. (Ultimately, about \$20,000 was given to support a second family.)

The Mohammads, a family of six with four children from ages 7 to 16, arrived in Marlborough in November of 2021, to an apartment underwritten by our funds and administered by Jewish Family Services. Members from the two congregations gathered furnishings for their new home, brought a wonderful welcome meal, and celebrated our new relationship.

Initially, the many medical challenges and coordination of rides to specialists and dentists was almost a full-time job. The children enrolled in the Marlborough schools, supported by several team members. The parents began taking English as a Second Language. Team members jostled paper work to get SNAP, heating oil, and general income support. The family needed work permits and an application for immigration status. Jewish Family Service provided resources, case workers, immigration lawyers, and translators among other supports. The team met weekly to share information and assign tasks. The father had major surgery in March of 2022.

The next challenge was to help the family get drivers licenses. There was studying for the learner's permit when English was not the first language. The summer of 2022, the dad and ultimately the eldest son got their learner's permits. Dad got his license in the fall of 2022, and the group assisted him in buying a car that would carry the whole family. UCC Boxborough provided a no interest loan for some of the cost of the car and paid about half the initial cost of car insurance. About that time, the father got a job at Target, and the mother did some seamstress work.

The son took driver's education, got his license early in 2023 and a car later that spring. He worked at Shaws and for Door Dash. He applied to and was accepted to Quinsigamond College that fall, getting a significant grant to pay many of his expenses.

The team and the family developed a delightful relationship, sharing tea and goodies on almost every visit. There was gifting of local produce from FreeBee Market, and trips to local attractions. We learned of their lives in Afghanistan and their perspective on their faith. We laughed together and cheered a variety of accomplishments. The children excelled at their school work. The team read the writing of one child, enjoyed the art work of a second, and watched the soccer games of another.

In the fall of 2023, the father received a grant from the National UCC and a second grant from Jewish Family Services to pay tuition for a course to drive big rig trucks. There were some hurdles related to language and cultural expectations which required the team to appeal for another round of testing, and ultimately, the dad received his Class A driver's license, offering a path for this family to become self-sufficient.

In May of 2024, we learned they had finally received Asylum and were on the way to an even more favorable status. We all celebrated. The following week, the family told the team of their plan to move to California, into a compound of family members. The hope is to start a branch of a trucking company. Although we are sad to see the family leave, it does feel like we are launching them to a new life with the tools that they need. We invite the congregation to offer a prayer and blessing for their good health and safety.

We are sending the family to California with a financial gift to help with their transition. There are funds remaining that were raised along with the ongoing repayment of the car loan. The proposal is, as of July I, that the remaining funds would return to the supervision of Faith in Action to be used for other refugee projects. If people have concerns about that plan, they are urged to reach out to the church moderator.

All on top of building community, awareness, and care for this world. Beautiful!


