We are in an exciting time, as we continue to prepare for our next settled pastor! Many thanks to those who have been providing input to the Transition Team while attending our Transition Meetings in April and May, by completing the Congregational Survey in June, and with your individual conversations and emails with members of the Transition Team. Your perspectives are invaluable as we continue to work on the Local Church Profile, the document we will use to attract candidates to our church, and as we prepare to call our next settled pastor.

We are blessed to have with us Rev. Richard Edens and Rev. Dr. Jill Edens as we navigate this process!

Tineke V. is leading the team of writers of the Local Church Profile. Working with Tineke are Laurel, Glynis, Peter, Todd, Larry, and Chris. The Profile is structured to address three primary questions: **Who are we? Who is our neighbor?** And **Who is God calling us to become?** Our responses to these questions will help candidates assess if our church is a good match for their calling to church ministry. This document includes (but isn't limited to) details about our church's history, vision, and mission, an introduction to living in the Acton/Boxborough area, a description of the position that we are trying to fill, specifics about what we are seeking in our next settled pastor, 11 years of financial and membership data, and demographic information about our current membership and the surrounding area. It is quite a heavy read! We hope to have this process completed during the summer weeks.

In parallel with the drafting of the Local Church Profile by Tineke's team, Larry W. is pulling together and orienting our Pastoral Search Team. This team is responsible for working closely with the Southern New England Conference of the UCC (SNEUCC) to advertise and attract candidates to apply for our position, interview qualified applicants, and recommend to the Church Council and ultimately the Congregation a final candidate for our opening of Settled Pastor.


The Congregation will need to vote to accept the Local Church Profile before it is provided to the Pastoral Search Team and the SNEUCC for circulation. According to our church bylaws, makeup of the Pastoral Search Team will need to be accepted by a majority vote of the Congregation before the committee can commence its work. Look for future information later this summer about these important votes!

UCCB Mission Movers — Caring for our Neighbors


Founded in the 1970s at the South Acton Congregational Church (SACC), Mission Movers has been helping neighbors in crisis move into new housing at a moment's notice. UCCB has partnered with SACC for a number of years and has formed a small team to help in this effort in our community through connections with Boxborough's Community Services Coordinator, Wendy Trinks, as well as with Sharon at Household Goods.

In June, a small team from UCCB joined with SACC to move an individual from one apartment in Acton, that had been home for over ten years, into new and more accessible lodging within Acton. She was so well organized for the move and very appreciative of our help.

Also in June, a small UCCB team helped a Boxborough resident complete the second phase of furniture movement within her home after water damage in her basement earlier this year. (First move was in February.) From the resident, "Thank you for everything. I overdid with my arthritis Saturday when I got anxious about mold proliferation, but would be in so much greater pain without your help. You are all amazing and inspiring."

An Open Invitation




